- ITF was recognized as the International Sports Organization by the Austrian Sports Federation and printed on the "Year Book" of Sports for 2004/2005 and for 2005/2006 as the sole International Sports Organization of which Secretariat has been located in Vienna, Austria (See page 292 on "Year Book" for 2004/2005).
- ITF was registered to the Finance Ministry of Austria as Non-Profit-Civilian Organization in Nov. 2004.
